Athens Township will request a 0.7 mill rate to levy on behalf of the Library at the August 2, 2022 election.

Millage Proposal FAQs

- 1. How does this affect my current tax assessment? The Township currently levels a .70 mill special assessment on real property for library service. This .70 mill millage is intended to **replace** that special assessment. However, there will be a tax increase assessed on business-personal property on all commercial, utility and industrial businesses that have a business-personal property true cash value above \$80,000. Currently, the 0.7 special assessment rate is not levied to business-personal property.
- 2. How will the library use these funds? The current 0.7 special assessment is 77 percent of the library's operating budget. We have supplemented with grants to fund new programs (grab and go bags, summer reading, reading counts, VOX audio books for kids, etc.).. This millage will provide the library with a base-level of funding to operate and offer various programs.
- 3. Why is it currently a special assessment rather than a millage? When the library was first established, a special assessment was implemented. However, the library is required under state law to reestablish, which requires a voted millage rather than a special assessment.
- **4.** What will happen with the library if this millage does not pass? The library has reserve funds to operate for approximately one year. Without a voted millage, the library's operating budget will be reduced by 77%.


Saturday Morning Story Time Returns
