Library Card Changes....

Beginning January 1, 2023, all patrons are required to fill out a new patron application. It will also be available on the web page. When filling out your application, please plan to have some form of **PROOF OF RESIDENCE.** This may include a Michigan Driver's License or Michigan ID Card with your current address, a utility bill with your current address, a rent invoice/receipt with your current address, or an Athens Township tax bill or receipt showing that you pay Township taxes. Students may use their school ID card or a print out of their information from the school grade system/attendance program.

Residents who live within and pay taxes to Athens Township receive a library card for no additional charge as each pays a millage with property taxes to support the library (this includes those who rent, as taxes are included in your monthly rent fees).

However, non-residents (those who do not pay Athens Township property taxes) are not assessed a millage to support the library through a millage. Therefore, they will be assessed a yearly fee of \$10 per patron with a cap of \$30 per family residing at the same address. Again, these must be assessed yearly to avoid unfair taxation. Please note: If you live in East Leroy or Fulton, etc. but own property in Athens Township, you are a resident as you pay property taxes on at least one Athens Township parcel. Please bring a tax bill or receipt to explain your residency.

Unattended Children Policy

It is the current policy of the library that an adult, preferably a parent or a guardian, who is at least 18 years old or older, must accompany children under the age of 9. We have had several children in the library who have created a disturbance for other patrons. We will appreciate parents/ guardians/adults coming into the library with their children. Unfortunately, we have found it necessary to dismiss unattended children, who repeatedly cause a disturbance or are destructive, from the library. In addition, several middleand high-school aged youth have been fraternizing in front of the library. They have left messes for others to clean, and police have been called more than once to break up fights and to settle arguments. We will appreciate it if you will discuss these problems with your children so the library can be a pleasant surrounding for everyone in the Athens Community.

Coronavirus Policy

- Masks and gloves are optional but strongly recommended.
- Maintain a distance of 3 6 feet between you and others to avoid human contact.
